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Vsebina:

Predmet obravnava koncept skupnosti v sodobnem družbene redu, ki ga označuje tehnološki razvoj, globalizacijski procesi in množični mediji. Uvodoma predstavi koncept človeške interakcije in skupnosti v družboslovnem smislu. Predmet razlikuje med različnimi tipi skupnosti in njihovim razvojem skozi čas. Poudarek predmeta pa je na vlogi globalizacije na oblikovanje in dojemanje skupnosti na katere vplivajo spremenjeni načini interakcije, vključujuč transnacionalne povezave in virtualne stike. V ospredju so koncepti identitet, identifikacij, odtujitve, racionalnosti, pripadanja, vključenosti in izključenosti. Povezuje paletu konceptov s sociološkimi in kulturno-antropološkimi teoretičnimi perspektivami.

Predmet se navezuje na spremembe v značilnostih človeške komunikacije in naraščajočo zmožnost ljudi zamišljanja in interakcij preko lokalnih in teritorialnih meja. Predmet tako obravnava družbo, kolektivnosti in posamezni, ki oblikujejo skupnosti v povezavi z družbenimi transformacijami kot so na primer:

- razvoj izključno segmentarnih prostorskih interakcij, ki temeljijo na plemenskih družbah v mestne države ter imperije, ki temeljijo na iznajdbi pisane besede;
- nastanek nacionalnih zamišljenih skupnosti, ki temelji na množičnem tisku;
- vplivi elektronskih medijev na globalizacijo v smislu globalne vasi in lokalizacijo v smislu močnega odpora etničnih in religioznih skupnosti;
- naraščajoča transnacionalna mobilnost in identifikacije, ki jih podpira IKT in na transport vezane tehnologije;
- on-line virtualne skupnosti, ki temeljijo na razvoju spleta.

Content (Syllabus outline):

The course addresses the concept of community in contemporary social order signified with technological development, globalisation processes and mass media. Firstly, it introduces the concepts of human interaction and community in sociological terms. It distinguishes between different types of communities and their evolution. Further, the emphasis is on the role of globalisation processes in the formation and perception of communities, which are influenced by transformed ways of interaction, including transnational connections and virtual contacts. It deals with the issues such as identities, identifications, alienation, rationality, belonging, inclusion and exclusion. It links these issues to a variety of sociological theoretical perspectives.

The course relates to the shifts in the features of human communities including the increasing ability of people to imagine and interact beyond the narrow local and territorial boundaries. The course will thus deal with the society, collectivity and individuals forming communities related social transformations such as:

- From segmental purely spatial interactions based tribal societies to city-states and empires based on the invention of writing;
- The formation of national imagined communities based on the printing-press;
- Globalisation – localisation effect in forming collectivises, the mixed-effects of electronic media toward both the ‘global village’ and the strong persistence of ethnic/religious communities;
- The increasing transnational mobilities and identifications increasingly supported by ICT and transport related technologies;
- On-line virtual communities based on the development of the web.

- Understanding the cultural phenomena and their relationship with the structure and the development of societies;
- Understanding different social and cultural environments, understanding the cultural pluralism.

Predvideni študijski rezultati:

- razume in uporabi sociološke in kulturno-antropološke koncepte skupnosti v povezavi z ostalimi koncepti;
- primerja različne tipe skupnosti in jih umesti v zgodovinsko in evolucijsko perspektivo;
- razume vpliv globalizacije, transnacionalizma in določenih tehnologij na nastanek ter ohranjanje različnih tipov skupnosti;
- razume koncepte izkoreninjenosti, transnacionalne navezanosti, dvoumnih identitet, deteritorializacije;
- aplicira relevantne sociološke in kulturno-antropološke koncepte na raziskovanje sodobnih skupnosti.

Intended learning outcomes:

- Understands and applies the sociological and cultural anthropological concepts of community and its relation to other key concepts;
- Compares different types of communities and places them in historical and evolutionary perspectives;
- Understands the impact of globalisation processes, transnationalism and particular technologies to the creation and persistence of different types of communities;
- Understands the issues of up-rooted belongings, transnational attachment, ambivalent identities and deterritorialization;
- Applies relevant sociological and cultural anthropological concepts to the exploration of contemporary communities.

Metode poučevanja in učenja:

- predavanja z aktivno udeležbo študentov (razlaga, diskusija, vprašanja, primeri);
- seminarske vaje (refleksija izkušenj, projektno delo, timsko delo, metode kritičnega mišljenja, diskusija, sporočanje povratne informacije, forum za reševanje kulturnih problemov, sporov, konfliktov in dilem, socialne igre);
- individualne in skupinske konzultacije (diskusija, dodatna razlaga, obravnava specifičnih vprašanj);
- samostojen študij (motiviranje, usmerjanje, samoopazovanje, samouravnavanje, refleksija, samoocenjevanje);

Learning and teaching methods:

- Lectures with active engagement of students (explanation, discussion, questions, examples);
- Tutorials (reflection on experience, project work, teamwork, critical thinking, discussion, feedback, a forum for solving cultural problems, disputes, conflicts and dilemmas, social games);
- Individual and group consultations (discussions, additional explanation, specific questions);
- Individual study (motivation, guidance, self-observation, self-regulation, reflection, self-evaluation);
